Old City Hall

The check from Gallagher Bassett Insurance Company has arrived. It's for \$30,082.12. This covers the damage on the building from the broken water line.

2018 LMIG Paving in Mustang Ridge

Paving was completed in Mustang Ridge on 5-15-18. The total cost of the paving was \$27,458.34. LMIG paid \$13,380.83 of this and SPLOST paid the rest. Total taken out of SPLOST was \$14,077.51

Reports

Police – The Police report was presented for review. Total income for the month of May that stayed in the City was \$8,783.98.

Compactor – The Compactor report was presented for review. Total revenue for May was \$349. The City made a profit of \$143.70.

Library – The Library report was presented for review. 1 new patron signed up in May; 44 visits to the library. The library made \$8.50.

Items of Business

• Ballfield

Councilwoman Johnson made a motion but then she withdrew her motion. Council is going to decide what all needs to be done to the ballfield and then put out a bid to get the work completed. Going to call GA Power to see how much it would cost to put up two poles and lights.

• LMIG

Councilman Fain made a motion to stripe all the roads in the City and buy signs with the 2019 LMIG money. Motion seconded by Councilwoman Johnson. So Approved.

• Old City Hall – Old Clinic Building

No motion was made. Each councilmember will turn in their recommendation on the value of the old city hall building and the old clinic building. Then will average out the value and that will be the reserve on the buildings. The City will then ask for sealed bids. This will be on next month's agenda.

• Skid Steer

Councilman Fain made a motion to buy the skid steer and grapple for \$62,200 government cash price. The check will be issued out of the general fund. Going to use money from last auction and payback general fund with SPLOST funds. Motion seconded by Councilman Holsomback. So Approved.

Councilman Fain made a motion to buy four-wheel drive Ford 550 truck along with a trailer. The maximum amount for both is \$75,000. The truck is supposed to be around \$68,000 and the trailer \$6,000. Pay \$10,000 down and finance the rest. Motion seconded by Councilman Holsomback. So Approved.

• Service Delivery Strategy Extension

Councilwoman Johnson made a motion to allow the Mayor to sign the service delivery strategy extension agreement. Motion seconded by Councilman Fain. So Approved.

• Lacey Building

No motion taken. Chief Bennett going to call Judge Sneed to issue an order and to also give notice to property owner.

• City Manager

No motion taken. To change the charter, you must go through the general assembly.
